In addition, employees will learn how to properly label chemicals and how OSHA's Hazard Communication standard applies to their area. Attendees will also receive a basic introduction to hazardous chemical spill clean up and response.

This SafetyNet presentation will cover the basics of electrical safety and recognizing potential hazards in the workplace. Training will include Arc Flash Awareness and will discuss the NFPA 70E 2015 standard, what an arc flash is, and proper work procedures and PPE to protect electrical workers. An arc flash is the dangerous explosive release of electrical energy caused by an electrical arc due to either a phase to ground or phase to phase fault. The explosive energy released can consist of heat, pressure wave, vaporized metal (plasma) molten metal and shrapnel. It is imperative that the proper PPE, tools and work practices are implemented
